(HI Specialist Teachers)

- Attend at the child's level
- Encourage eye-contact, so that the child can watch the lip patterns as you speak
- Directly teach new vocabulary
- Directly teach how to pronounce new words
- Provide many opportunities for repetition
- Use visual resources
- Provide multi-sensory methods to supplement auditory information
- Enjoy clapping games to help support word learning breaking the words down into syllables
- Repeat and rephrase to help support understanding
- Sign, say and symbol to help support understanding
- Provide additional support for phonic learning activities cued articulation
