
Structured conversations

Solution circles

 A solution circle is a short and powerful tool that takes up to an hour. The approach was developed by Forrest, Pearpoint and colleagues (1996) and it aims to bring together a group of people to generate ideas for solutions to a particular problem.

Solution circles

- SOLUTION CIRCLE Inclusion Press
- 30 minutes
- Given roles problem presenter, process facilitator, note taker, brainstorm team
- Step 1 problem presenter 6 minutes
- Step 2 Brainstorm 6 minutes
- Step 3 Dialogue led by problem presenter 6 minutes
- Step 4 The first step focus person and group decide 6 minutes
- Round of words



Additional ideas/tips

- Have a Solution focused question
- Ask someone to chair and take notes
- For very difficult conversations employ a mediator
